



Some information about the Library of the German Archaeological Institute in Rome

Dear readers,

In our newly renovated building, access to the library is located on the 3rd floor, where the office of the library assistants is situated. They are responsible for issuing new library cards and extending expired ones. Here, you can also obtain additional information and a personal WLAN password.

On the same floor, you will find:

- The display of **new publications** and yet-to-be-bound **journal issues**;
- The **offices** of the librarians;
- A **scanner** and an **OPAC** for self-use.

Reading tables are available on the **3rd and 4th floors**.

The office of the **library management** is on the **4th floor**, where an additional **scanner** and **OPAC** are also available.

Scanner usage is free but limited to **15 minutes** per person.

Journals, monographs, and oversized shelves are distributed across the library rooms from the 1st to the 4th floor, and books can be taken directly.

All items with the shelf mark "**Magazin**" or "**Mag**" must be ordered and picked up at the office of the library assistants on the 3rd floor.

On the **2nd floor**, you will find a third OPAC and three large tables, where working in smaller groups is permitted.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that the Rome department of the DAI has **electronic resources (E-Journals and E-Books)** accessible to library visitors on their own devices via the DAI's WLAN.

We kindly ask you to carefully read the new **library regulations**, which contain important information for the proper use of the library.
